

Safe Places

Madeley Town Council are proud to be part of the Safe Places Shropshire scheme offering safe places to help and support people who may become vulnerable whilst they are out and about in our local area. Madeley Community Library, Jubilee House, The Hub on the Hill



and Park Lane Centre provide a 'short-term safe havens' for people who may require assistance, just look at for the posters in our buildings. The national 'Safe Places' network provide vulnerable people with a number of places that they know they can go to and immediately receive support and understanding about their issues. Anyone can use a 'Safe Place' and it is hoped that the scheme gives people more confidence to travel independently. It will also allow carers to feel reassured that there is always likely to be help nearby for their loved ones.



Do you want your business or organisation to be part of the Save Places Scheme?

It is a simple. Each location that signs up to the initiative will display a sticker that identifies it as a 'Safe Place'. To make this contact easier the vulnerable person may have a "I need Help" card with details of who to contact on their behalf. Madeley Town Council has 6 passes for the Ironbridge Gorge Museums that our residents who live in Madeley, Sutton Hill & Woodside can borrow.

These passes give you one day entry to all the Ironbridge Gorge Museums (excluding events).

All we ask for is a £10 refundable deposit, photo ID & proof of address in Madeley, Sutton Hill & Woodside. Disabled visitors who use our pass can have one carer admitted free of charge. Children under 5 are free.

The Passes must be booked in advance, collected from Jubilee House and returned after your visit to allow other families to use them.

Getting social in Madeley

We had a great start to our Madeley Social group when it began in May, and we hope it will continue to thrive through the Autumn and Winter sessions. We've got a schedule in place for a range of activities so if you're over 55, why not consider coming along and taking part.

Madeley Social takes place during term-time on Thursdays from 1-3pm.

Most sessions are £2 per week which ensures we can keep you topped up with a variety of biscuits to have alongside a steady stream of tea and coffee.

It's a friendly group, so if you feel a bit out of your depth coming along to something new, please don't worry, you'll soon settle in and find people you enjoy chatting

We ask that you pre-book sessions in advance wherever possible as we do have a limit on the number of people we can welcome along and don't wish to turn you away on the day. Just pop into Jubilee House to pay for your chosen sessions to secure your place.

We're excited to be heading off to Chester Christmas Market in November for our Madeley Social trip. It's open to both members (those who attend three or more sessions before the trip) and non-members. Members pay just £10 while the cost for non-members will be £15. The trip will pick up from the bus stop on the High Street opposite Jubilee House at 9.15am, and leave Chester at 3pm, giving you plenty of time to browse the market stalls and shops, and even enjoy some lunch or snacks along the way.

Who are we?

Shropshire, Telford and Wrekin Talking Therapies are a free NHS Service, providing a range of recommended therapies for common mental health problems, such as anxiety or low mood. We are trained Psychological Therapists, and we offer information, guidance and talking therapies in a range of different formats.

Who is our service for?

Anyone aged over 16 years old registered with a GP in Telford & Wrekin or Shropshire who may be experiencing:

- Anxiety
- Post-Traumatic Stress Disorder
- Depression
- Phobia

- Panic
- Obsessive Compulsive Disorder (OCD)
- Social Anxiety
- · Health Anxiety

How we can help you

The support on offer will focus on helping you move forward and will concentrate on steps that you can take yourself to tackle your difficulties. This can include many different options, including online supported programmes, courses, and one-to-one interventions. We can also signpost you to other services in the area that may be useful to you. You can self-refer and arrange a first appointment online, or call us if you prefer to register by phone. Once your referral is processed we will send you a link to book an appointment online.

During this appointment, the practitioner will discuss your difficulties with you and look at ways in which we can support you to help yourself improve your wellbeing. During your call, we will ask you some questions from a questionnaire to try to understand how severe your difficulties are at the moment. At the end of the appointment, we will talk through the available treatments and agree on next steps.

Services we offer

Online Supported Programmes

We provide access to online supported CBT (cognitive behavioural therapy) programmes, tailored to your specific needs. The programmes consist of several modules. You can complete these at your own pace, in your own time. The goal is for you to take the information and techniques learned and start applying them in your day-to-day life.

At regular intervals, a trained Psychological Therapist will check your progress by telephone or online, and provide feedback and guidance.

Courses

We offer a range of different courses that you may find helpful to book into, covering various topics. These courses are offered both online and face to face, and are focusing on teaching techniques and learning skills. Please check out our websites to look at the timetable of courses available.

One-To-One Support

We offer one to one support with one of our specially trained Psychological Therapists, this can be offered online (via OneConsultation), by telephone, or at a local venue dependant on your needs and where would be more convenient for you.

The sessions are time limited and will focus on helping you move forward, by learning new skills and techniques to tackle your difficulties.

Personal Information

All personal information provided to the Trust is treated confidentially. There are, however, some important times when we will need to share information with others in order to optimise your care. It is the responsibility of all health professionals to share some information with your GP and possibly other health care professionals.

This is particularly important if there is information which would help to prevent you from harming yourself or someone else.

Talking Therapies can help you identify your thoughts, influence the way you respond to things, helping you to change how you are feeling, for the better.

Signing Up

Signing up is simple, free & for any age. Children under 16 will need to provide a parent/quardian's contact details. If you are an adult, please remember to bring a form of ID, or simply something with your name on.

You can take out up to 10 books and 10 audios for 3 weeks. You can borrow and return books at any branch.

You will receive a library card and a 4-digit PIN. This will give you access to all the Telford & Wrekin Libraries. It will also give you access to our computers, printing services and Kiosk machines.

Renewing

You can renew books in person, online or via the phone.

Stay and Play activities are designed to support learning and development through play.

We are collaborating with children's Mind, the NHS and Family Hubs to provide family drop-in sessions and extra support.

Schools

We work closely with local schools to stock the books children need for their studies, helping families access the right resources easily.

We encourage school and nurseries visits to the library, if you would like to arrange a visit please contact us directly.

Additionally, we are happy to serve 'hot chocolate' to students studying in the local area.



A Welcoming Space

This library is breastfeeding-friendly and recognised as a safe space for families.

Disability Support

The library is fully accessible, with step-free access on the ground floor and disabled toilets available. All our bookcases are the recommended distance for wheelchair users. Additionally, we have free parking on-site, including designated disabled spaces.

Applications & Further Support

We can assist with submitting applications for Blue Badges and Bus Passes. If your application is successful, these will be sent directly to you by post.

The Community Hub is open every Wednesday, offering access to a range of community support services.

We work in partnership with organisations including Citizens Advice, Telford Autism Hub, Healthy Lifestyles and many others.

Every Friday morning, we hold 'Sunflower Hour,' a designated quiet time during which all devices should be placed on silent to support individuals with sensory needs.

The Home Library Service

The Home Library Service is a free service which offers the regular delivery of books to your home. This is for those who may find visiting a local library difficult because of age, disability or responsibility of caring for someone else.

Directory of services

Blood Pressure Checking – Weekly service with trained volunteers able to check your blood pressure and advise you of next steps if your numbers show concern.

Healthy Lifestyles - Weekly service offering information, advice and support whether you want to eat better, drink less, exercise more, reduce your weight, stop smoking, or lower your blood pressure, cholesterol or risk of developing type two diabetes.

Social Prescribers - Weekly service. Social prescribers are embedded within local GP surgeries alongside GPs and other practice staff aiming to connect you to community services and activities that support your health and wellbeing using a therapeutic approach, as well as providing practical, helpful and non-judgemental support.

Independent Living Centre – The Independent Living Centre offers both preventative and responsive support to individuals to enable them and their families to live well and safe in their community, potentially remaining independent in their own homes for longer.

People can come along to receive support around daily living as well as access the wide-ranging information, advice and signposting the centre offer. As well as receiving advice and support you'll be able to see and try a number of "gadgets" that can make independent living a reality.

Telford & Wrekin CVS -

SENDIASS - Telford and Wrekin SENDIASS service provides access to impartial and independent information about Special Educational Needs and Disability (SEND), health and social care for children, young people and their parents

We can give you information in relation to SEND law to enable you to participate in and make informed decisions regarding your child's education, as well as supporting you to prepare for meetings, explaining and understanding reports, listening to your views and concerns and ultimately work to build positive outcomes.

Young Carers - The Young Carers Service provides advice and support for all young carers in Telford from age 5 to 18 offering one-to-one support, term-time Youth Club, holiday and half-term activities, trips and events, school drop-ins information and advice for the whole family and more.

If you think you're a young carer or you know a child or young person who is caring, come along and speak to us for more information and advice.







Directory of services

Carers Team - The Carers Team support and enable unpaid family carers, over the age of 18, to improve their quality of life and to be more confident and able in their caring role. The team can provide listening ear and give support when it is needed most, help access available support and services, create opportunities to have a voice in the planning and development of services, access appropriate financial support, provide up to date information, and access support groups that provide an opportunity to socialise and take a break from their caring role, share information, gain support and discuss topics of interest with carers in similar situations. If you, or someone you know is an adult carer, come and have a chat.

Telford Autism Hub - Come and speak to us about all aspects of adult autism including understanding more about autism, support to find out if you are autistic, how to access other help and support, as well as opportunities to meet and socialise with others and support to become more confident and independent.

Telford Children's Autism Hub - Whether your child has just received a diagnosis, or you are looking for information to help your child flourish out team are here to offer you guidance and support. Our Children's Autism Hub is open to all children and young people aged 0-18, and their families, who have a diagnosis of Autism. To access our Children's Autism Hub you need to be a resident of Telford and Wrekin.

Citizen's Advice - Come along and chat to an advisor if you're looking to make your money go further, are unsure if you might be entitled to benefits, or think you might be paying too much for you gas and electricity. We will have access to advice and bookings on the day.

Healthy Heart Bus - Have your height and weight measured, along with your blood pressure, cholesterol and blood sugars tested to provide you with an idea of our cardiovascular health. It's an opportunity to find out valuable information, and take preventative action to improve your long-term health for yourself and your family.

Carers Project/Adult Practitioner - Providing help and support to unpaid carers in the local community, completing carers assessments and giving information to help people within that caring role, such as help access to local groups and other Telford & Wrekin Council support which may be on offer.

Housing Plus Group - Members of Housing Plus Group will be available to discuss all things lettings, tenancy and other issues within the community.

Christians Against Poverty (CAP) - Help and advice around debt and poverty. With a team of hundreds of dedicated staff members and hundreds of incredible churches delivering services, people in desperate need are discovering life-changing freedom and hope every day. A Better Tomorrow

Telford project to tackle domestic abuse wins new funding

A pioneering project which supports survivors of domestic abuse and provides training to help tackle the issue has had its funding extended for a further year.

Now the Lived Experience Advisory Forum (LEAF) wants to hear from more people who have lived through domestic abuse and more companies which want to take advantage of its free training to help address the issue.

LEAF is a joint project between community interest companies A Better Tomorrow and Voices Social Enterprise and works to raise awareness of domestic abuse across Telford & Wrekin and ensure that services meet the needs of victims and survivors.

Tracey Secker, the founder of Voices Social Enterprise, said the new funding from Telford & Wrekin Council would take the project through to at least March 2026.

"We're delighted to have secured funding for another year," she said.

"We want to hear from as many victims and survivors as possible through our feedback groups, so that we can ensure that the support services available across Telford reflect their needs and are exactly what is required.

"And we also want to hear from more companies and businesses which want to take part in our free training sessions and our ambassador programme. It's vital that as many people as possible can spot the signs of domestic abuse, and that companies and other groups can offer support and help.

Chief executive officer at A Better Tomorrow, Scott Morgan

"One in four women and one in seven men will experience domestic abuse. One person on a recent training session told me that they didn't think they knew anybody who was a victim until they had had the training, and then they realised they knew three or four.

"That's the difference we can make working with the business community."

Scott Morgan, A Better Tomorrow chief executive, said: "The LEAF project has been a huge success since it launched in September, and we are delighted that it will continue its work supporting survivors and raising awareness in the wider community."

Voices Social Enterprise delivers domestic abuse awareness training for organisations and individuals, along with supporting organisations and businesses to create domestic abuse policies.

The organisation also raises awareness on trauma and other forms of abuse and collaborates with a number of individuals with lived experience and non-profit organisations.

A Better Tomorrow, based in Woodside, Telford, was set up in 2014 to offer supported housing and a recovery programme for people with addiction and substance misuse. Its work has since expanded to include housing and support for those with mental health issues and homeless people, and most recently to provide a refuge for single women fleeing domestic abuse.



Flags of Service: A Lasting Tribute **Through Community Art**

Woodside Working Together: Building a Stronger Future for the Community

A major new initiative has been launched on the Woodside Estate that aims to put local people at the heart of positive change. Woodside Working Together is a five-year programme, funded by the National Lottery Community Fund, designed to strengthen community connections, support local priorities, and create new opportunities for residents.

The programme is being delivered through The Park Lane Centre by a small but dedicated team – the project lead, Snow and the newly appointed support worker, Louis – who will work alongside existing community groups, initiatives, and a new Community Forum. The Forum will play a central role in identifying priorities and shaping projects, ensuring that local voices are heard at every stage.

Listening First: Community Forum Launch

The project began with a Community Consultation event aimed at understanding local strengths and challenges, hearing directly from residents about their experiences, and identifying where improvements could make the biggest difference. This approach reflects the core ethos of Woodside Working Together: collaboration, empowerment, and action rooted in the community.

Delivering Local Projects Each Year

Over the course of the programme, the team is committed to delivering at least three community initiatives per year, each linked to National Lottery goals, community priorities, and wider partnerships across the area. For the first year (April to April), the projects are:

- Youth Education, Employment & Aspirations Project supporting young people who may be at risk of becoming NEET (Not in Education, Employment or Training) through a mix of skills development, mentoring, and access to opportunities.
- Winter Fuel Poverty Initiative launching in November to provide essential support for households struggling with rising energy costs.
- Local Community Directory creating a go-to resource to connect residents with services, groups, and opportunities in Woodside.

Youth Focus: The Hangout Café

The first major project to launch is the Youth Education, Employment & Aspirations Project, beginning this summer with the opening of The Hangout Café at The Park Lane Centre. Aimed at young people aged 14+, the café provides a safe and welcoming space to socialise while also offering vital support. Alongside free food and activities, young people can access:

- ✓ CV support and interview skills
- ✓ Mentoring, volunteering, and mental health guidance
- ✓ Work shadowing opportunities





By offering real alternatives, the project aims to build resilience, improve wellbeing, and open doors to brighter futures for young people while reducing risks linked to exploitation or involvement in the criminal justice system.

Powered by Volunteers

A key part of Woodside Working Together is harnessing the skills, time, and lived experience of local residents. Volunteers will play an active role in driving projects forward, supporting local research, and helping build resilience across the community. In turn, the programme will provide training, experience, and opportunities to upskill - ensuring that the benefits of the project last well beyond its five-year funding.

A Community Built Together

By combining strong local partnerships, volunteer power, and a commitment to listening to residents, Woodside Working Together is more than just a project - it's a movement to create lasting positive change across the estate. As the programme develops, its success will depend on the same principle it was founded on: working together as a community, for the community.

Woodside Working Together: Pop-Up Youth Café Going from Strength to Strength

The Woodside Pop-Up Youth Café, part of the Woodside Working Together Project funded by the National Lottery Community Fund, has been a real hit with local young people.

Held every other Friday evening from 5.00pm-8.00pm at Woody's Café in The Park Lane Centre, the café offers free food, fun activities, and a welcoming space for young people to socialise and connect. Each week, local services also join in, providing information, support, and opportunities tailored to young people's needs.

The response has been fantastic, with 30-50 young people attending each session. The project is also helping to build skills for the future by training up young volunteers to help run the kitchen, offering them valuable training and work experience.

Looking ahead, Woodside Working Together is excited to announce a Careers Fair on Thursday 26th September, running alongside the Hangout Café. Local businesses, services, and colleges are being invited to take part, giving young people a chance to explore opportunities in education, employment, skills development, and volunteering - and to take positive steps toward their futures.

The café is currently funded until May 2026, but with its growing success, plans are underway to secure funding to continue the service for as long as it's needed.

Woodside's Pop-Up Youth Café is proving that when a community works together, it can create lasting change and brighter opportunities for young people.

Message from Shaun Davies MP



Following the election on 4th July 2024 - when you did me the honour of electing me as your MP - September marks around a year of actually sitting in Parliament. It's been a whirlwind of a year, and I'm only just catching my breath.

New Governments tend to move at breakneck speed in their first year, and this one was no exception. We've already seen legislation passed to bring our railways into public ownership; to set up GB Energy, a publicly-owned clean energy provider; to ban bonuses for bad water bosses; and more. There's plenty more in the pipeline, too, including the Crime and Policing Bill and Border Security, Asylum and Immigration Bill.

As well as changing laws, the Government has got on with the hard work of fixing our economy, our public services and our broken foundations. Already, the NHS waiting list has hit a new two-year low; the rate of forced migration returns is up 14% on the previous year; and we've had three straight quarters of growth.

For me personally, I've loved every minute of having Telford's back over the past year. I've supported more than 6000 constituents through casework, saving them over £125,000; helped secure £199m in Government funding for Telford & Wrekin Council, and £159m for West Mercia Police: and made more than 60 visits to Telford schools. businesses, stakeholders and partners.

I'll always stand up for all of Telford, but the last year has brought some real highlights in Madeley specifically. I was proud to hold my first ever MP coffee morning at the Anstice in Madeley Library; I attended Madeley's absolutely incredible VE Day celebrations; and I turned on the Madeley Christmas lights for a second year in a row.

Madeley Orchard, Madeley United Charity

In the last few weeks, the Orchard has reopened and good news it is too. It is wonderful to see people sitting, walking dogs, and just enjoying the beauty of this area. It was a much-missed space while we were sorting a few legal and financial issues behind the scenes.

The Orchard is owned by Madeley United Charity. We have five trustees at present and are working on a couple more to be responsible for this historic charity. We have Rev Dawn Taffinder, Phil Owens, Cllr Derek White, Cllr Janice Jones and Rev Andy Ackroyd. Having a full complement of trustees makes running this amazing charity more realistic. We have also managed to get access to the bank accounts relating to the trust, which in turn means public liability insurance and water can now be paid for. All good progress and great news.

Returning to an open 'Orchard' was much anticipated and eagerly awaited, but we also knew that mother nature would not have waited for practicalities to be sorted. On returning to this beautiful space, we all knew that it would be overgrown and needing some TLC. With a little help from a local contractor, and a huge amount of work from the 'Madeley Orchard Group', on Tuesday and Thursday mornings – they are turning this around very impressively. Thank you to the growing number of volunteers who turn up to help on these mornings. The trustees appreciate your time, commitment and hard work. More helpers always gratefully received.

Open afternoon

We are having an open afternoon on Saturday 11th October 2pm -4pm. The trustees will be on site, snacks and drinks will be freely available. The invitation is to come and spend time in the Orchard and chat to us about what hopes you have for this valued community

Partners / Stakeholders

In the new year we will be calling a public meeting for possible partners and stakeholders. We are looking for individuals, groups, organisations, schools and businesses who want to see the Orchard flourish and who want their organisation to access and use this place

Some groups or organisations may want an area or a project that they can be responsible for. Some may want it for art, wellbeing or a whole host of other appropriate activities. Once we have an idea of who is interested, we will plan for the future. We will create a booking system for groups, raise our presence on social media, and also create a 'management group' - that look after the day to day running of the Orchard and also are accountable to the trustees.

The Orchard will of course remain open any time for individuals to walk, sit, reflect and relax. Individuals are of course covered on our public liability insurance. Group use is something we want to encourage, but the trustees will have to do due diligence around safeguarding, insurance and risk assessments – as you would expect in the modern world.

The orchard is back, it belongs to you, come and enjoy it once again.



Madeley Orchard Volunteers

It's lovely for us to be back on the Orchard after the 3 months of lockdown out. During that time everything went on growing, especially the grass and the weeds. Madeley United Charities, who owns the land, managed eventually to sort out the insurance and all the paperwork. They also agreed to pay a contractor with heavy mowing machines to come in and cut the open areas and for this we are very grateful.



The volunteers were delighted to be back. We had been meeting every week at the gate and going on a walk planned by one of the group. Often ending in coffee and cake. This bought the group closer together and friendships grew, but it was still good to get back.

We quickly realised this was a very big job and we needed help. Some local people who love the Orchard offered to help. We fixed a date and they came with shears, secateurs and strimmers. The amazing group that work on Beeches field also came and performed miracles. They took over the rows of fruit trees and have been coming for several weeks. We could not have managed without them, they did a great job and are still coming.







The Men in Sheds have also helped us get back on our feet. They collected the broken gate joining us to the church and rebuilt it and rehung it so it's now bigger and better than before. They also helped with bench repairs and removal of graffiti.

It was also great to have the group from Home Farm return to us. They had really missed their visits to us. They have now cleared the raised beds and are starting to replant them.

We have photographs of our first viewing after the 3 months. Although it looks very green, the very long grass growing into the trees is a highway for unwanted insects that may damage them. After all the strimming and cutting it does look brown now but it will green up and the trees will appreciate it.

> Some of our visitors and some of the group have asked if they can meet for a second day. We are trialling a Thursday morning also 10 till 1.

We as the Orchard group are really grateful for all the help we have been given. Members of the community are visiting again, we have had problems with some of the trees. Despite that the majority of people have been very positive and supportive and have congratulated us on what we are doing. September is the best fruit picking time. We do not encourage trying unripe apples as children may get stomach aches, if thrown in the pond it can contaminated the water.

The biggest thanks from us go to Men in Sheds, Men with strimmers and community friends who came to help. Most of all to the Tuesday team from Ironbridge Meadows group. They usually maintain the Beeches and Lodge field local nature reserve. If you are interested in helping them they can be found on their face book page. 


Delivering the Armed Forces Covenant

Prostate Testing

Prostate testing involves a simple blood test, delivered by qualified Phlebotomists, and analysed by a specialist laboratory with results delivered directly to the person tested, generally within 24 to 48 hours. Ironbridge Lions ran their first test session at the Anstice in Madeley in 2017. On that occasion we tested a total of 420 men, all of whom had queued for up to two hours just to get into the building.



Since that first session our testing programme has delivered around 4500 tests and the need to gueue has long since disappeared. This year, in three sessions, we delivered 680 tests with an average turn-round time of under 15 minutes. The majority of these tests produce a green result but there are always a small percentage of amber and red results. Not all will lead to the need for treatment of course but some will, and we know that our programme has saved many lives over the past 9 years.

We expect to repeat our regular test programme again in the new year and we are always happy to discuss adding further sessions during the course of the year. 

Anti-knife crime t-shirts help promote unity and belonging

The initiative is just one part of our Explore, Grow and Belong mission, aiming to empower young people, inspire a sense of belonging and provide positive activities and safe spaces. Currently, we support more than 15 youth programmes each week across Telford & Wrekin and Shropshire, alongside extensive holiday activities and school partnerships.

The idea for the t-shirts came from reports of rising knife crime - including recent statistics from West Mercia Police (the force which covers the region) which showed a rate of 42 incidents per 100,000 people, a rise of 18% compared to the previous year.

Councillor Angela McClements, who worked alongside Councillor Lee Carter to help launch the Youth Club at Arleston Community Centre at the end of 2024, said the centre's Trustees were 'delighted' to provide sponsorship.

"I know that the children have been so proud and excited to wear their tops. The Trustees recognise that sponsoring Youth Club tops is a great way to foster a sense of community and belonging among the children.

"It not only enhances their experience at the club, but also promotes pride in being part of it. This initiative can significantly impact the children by encouraging teamwork, confidence and a real sense of belonging."

Councillor Helena Morgan, Mayor of Madeley Town Council, said the council was proud to have given a grant to support the Youth Club and the work undertaken by 4 All Foundation with the young people of Sutton Hill. She added: "Over the last six months, the youth provision in Sutton Hill has successfully grown and Madeley Town Council, supported by 4 All Foundation, is now funding three age-specific youth groups each week offering activities, sports and a safe place for young people to visit."

Telford-based clothing supplier My Workwear not only sponsored the tops but also printed and designed them too. Co-owner James Worthington added: "We're really proud to support 4 All Foundation with their children's t-shirts, for such an important programme. 

From Madeley to Garrison Sergeant Major - that's the journey of the man newly announced as 4 All Foundation's new Patron.

Andrew 'Vern' Stokes OBE MVO DL is set to act as an ambassador for our charity, which supports the very communities he grew up in, and says he is 'delighted' about the appointment.



Having grown up in Madeley and attended the former BRJ School in Wellington, now known as Holy Trinity Academy, Vern enlisted in the British Army aged 16 and travelled the world, undertaking operational tours in Northern Ireland, Iraq, Afghanistan and Bosnia among others.

Vern trained countless soldiers at Sandhurst, taking on the role of Academy Sergeant Major (at the time the most senior post a soldier could attain) and being awarded a Meritorious Service Medal, True Englishman of the Year by the St George's Day Society, and an OBE in the King's first Birthday Honours list. Additionally, he has been appointed Member of the Royal Victorian Order (MVO) and Deputy Lieutenant of the County of Shropshire (DL).

Over the past decade, he has held the role of Garrison Sergeant Major, planning and delivering State Ceremonial events as prestigious as Queen Elizabeth II's funeral, the Royal British Legion Festival of Remembrance (for which he won a BAFTA), King Charles III's Coronation, and the VE Day 80 military ceremonial events.

He says: "As a youngster growing up in Telford, I relied upon organisations offering similar opportunities to those that the 4 All Foundation now deliver. They shaped me, kept me occupied, gave me purpose and experiences that I still remnisce about, ultimately giving me the confidence to begin my career, and that is why I am delighted to be appointed as their Patron. The charity is helping people to find their feet, supporting their needs and building communities across Shropshire."

Our Director of Operations, George Hounsell, added: "There are a huge number of successful people who have connections to Shropshire, but when you consider the impact Vern Stokes has had in defending our country, organising some of the most important ceremonies of the past decade, and teaching the next generation of Army recruits, it's hard to think of someone more inspirational to appoint as our Patron.

"We are extremely lucky to have Vern on board with the charity, especially given how incredibly busy he is - but his lifelong commitment to giving back to the community where he was raised is as admirable as his list of honours and awards!














New mobility scooters at **Blists Hill Victorian Town**

In March, the Ironbridge Gorge Museum Trust launched an appeal to raise money to buy all-terrain mobility scooters for use by visitors at Blists Hill Victorian Town.

By the summer holidays the Trust, a heritage conservation and education charity, had secured funding for not one but two mobility scooters, which visitors have been able to make use of throughout the busy summer holiday period.

The 52-acre museum, a recreation of a working-class town on the East Shropshire Coalfields in 1900, is spread across different levels with a steep incline between the upper part of the town, home to bustling Victorian shops and trade

workshops, and the lower part of the town, home to an ironworks, mine, Victorian homes and more.

Funding from trusts and a private donor has made it possible to raise the money needed to buy two scooters.

The scooters, named Victoria and Henry, are available on a first come first serve basis. We expect to introduce two more scooters soon.



The Trust is still seeking funders for more scooters.


