The Houses of Parliament Tour



On the 24th of November, I and multiple members of the community took a trip and toured Parliament, organised by our MP Shaun Davies. Bright and early, we set off for London and arrived just before 12 o'clock where the first batch of visitors were toured around Parliament. I, as having never been to London before, never mind Parliament, was incredibly excited and the trip exceeded my expectations.

The Houses of Parliament, otherwise known as the Palace of Westminster, was constructed in 1045 by Edward the Confessor and was the principle residence of England's monarchs. The House worked as an administrative body and became the permanent residence of Parliament after Henry VIII moved out of the Palace of Westminster after a fire – Parliament has been continuously built upon and reconstructed however remnants of its past still remain preserved today. For example, the main hall where we first entered served as a hub, and across the walls were intricate detailing, with the end of the hall designed with gorgeous pieces of stained glass artwork, which serve to separate different pathways in which people take around Parliament.

While we weren't able to see inside the Chambers, we ended up standing in the main area that separates the House of Commons and the House of Lords, being allowed to observe the milieu. However, my favourite parts of the tour came from learning tidbits of history surrounding the noble suffragettes and stories about these women who fought for women's rights.

For example, in the St Stephen's Chapel, which preserves the remnants of Roman Catholic designs that churches in England previously had prior to Henry VIII, there is a small cupboard in St Mary Undercroft, where Emily Davison hid on the night of the 1911 census, where she remained overnight to avoid being entered onto the census and was part of her fight for women's rights. As such, she is named in the 1911 census as living in the cupboard of the Chapel of St Mary Undercroft – she would remain unacknowledged as a part of Parliaments history until Tony Benn, a member of the Labour Party and political activist, forcefully fixed a plaque to the inside of the cupboard in retaliation to force them to acknowledge their past with women's suffrage. There is now a memorial and information about her life plastered to the wall next to the cupboard where Emily Davison was found.

The tour was fascinating and I had an immense amount of enjoyment touring a site with such interesting history. The many stories about Parliament were very informative and being able to tour such a rich, historical site made the trip all the more memorable!

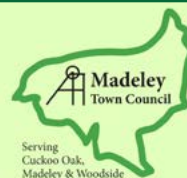

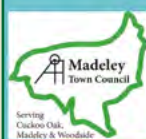

1. Citizens Advice:

Citizens Advice Telford & the Wrekin are on hand to provide you with information, signposting and to book in appointments for all areas of advice including Benefits, Debt, Energy, Housing, Employment and more.

2. Healthy Lifestyles Team:

Healthy Lifestyles Advisors can help you live a healthier life, do more of the things you want to do, and generally improve how you feel. With personalised one to one support you can learn to eat better, drink less, exercise more, reduce your weight, lower your blood pressure and cholesterol and reduce your risk of developing type 2 diabetes. If you're a smoker, you can also get support to help you stop; something that can make a big difference to your health, as well as the health of your family and friends. 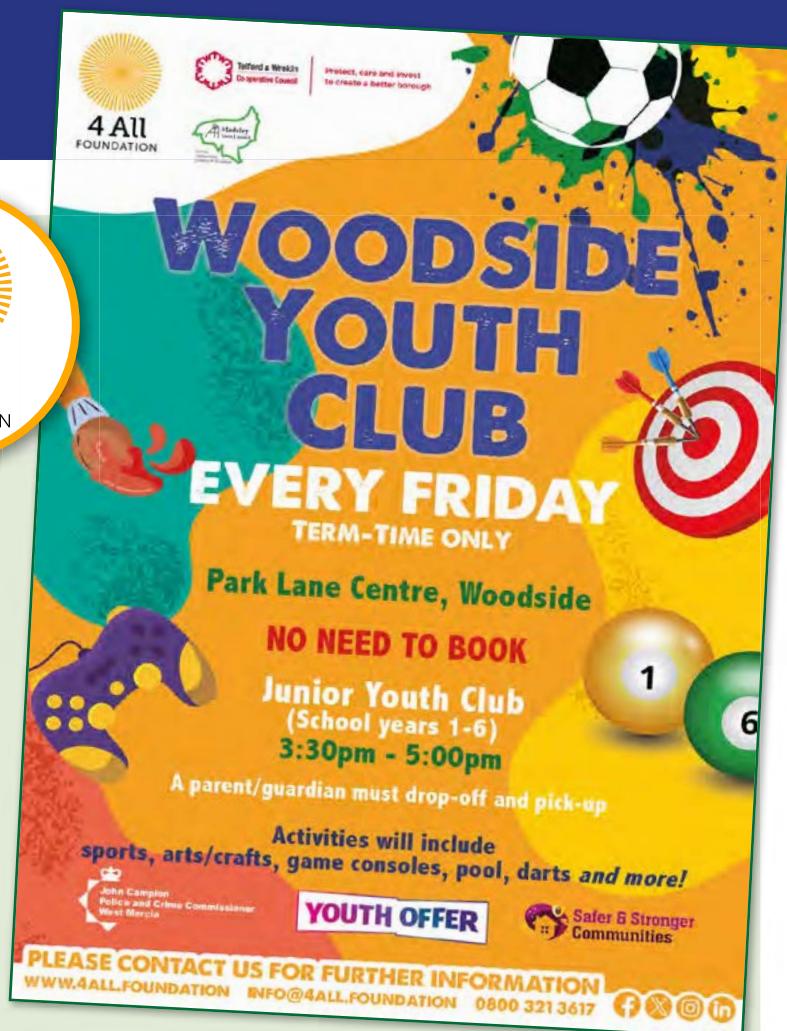

Message from Shaun Davies MP



Happy New Year, Madeley, if it's not too late to say that!

Nevertheless, this is a great opportunity to update you on a couple of things for 2026.

Like you, Telford is my home. I live here, I'm raising my family here and I see every day both the pressures facing our community and the incredible things that happen across our town because of the brilliant people who live and work here too.

I also see the enormous opportunity we have to build a stronger future for Telford. Last year I was absolutely delighted to secure record investment for our town, with a major focus on which will benefit Ironbridge, Madeley, Woodside and Sutton Hill including £30 million of combined Government and Council funding. This will support, local jobs and careers, safer, cleaner neighbourhoods, upgraded community facilities, housing and public spaces - together with £9m of government funding to secure the future of Ironbridge Gorge Museums Trust, a new partnership with the National Trust. Almost £40m coming to South Telford - with more to come.

On top of this we heard just before the Christmas break that Telford & Wrekin Council will receive an extra £66.6m under the Fair Funding programme, giving councils the resources to restore libraries, youth services, clean streets and community hubs. After years of cuts when I was Council Leader, we are now seeing record investment in our borough.

I know securing a better and fairer deal for Telford is important - but equally, it's important we secure real change for our Town too. Getting stuff done is my new year resolution. And together we will.

It was a real joy for me, along with my family to turn on Madeley Christmas lights, hold my first event of 2026 in Sutton Hill and to bring government ministers to Woodside.

It is the honour of my life to represent you and our town in Parliament - and I know there is more to do and get right - and I promise to stand up for you and our town.

Whilst accessing digital therapy, you will be supported by a trained clinician online to help you achieve your goals.

Below are some quotes from previous users of our service who we have supported to help improve their mood and achieve their goals.

The idea of an online therapeutic toolkit sounded a bit farfetched and if I'm honest in the past seen it as a placebo exercise for an under resourced and much needed service... as soon as I logged on I liked this site. Whilst I do not do social media, I can work my way round a computer despite my dyslexia. I quickly navigated the pages, reviewed my tools, and clocked how my supporter would be able to give suggestions around my thought process.

Found the online support very helpful and gentle. It was reassuring to be able to monitor my progress and have somewhere to go to 'get it all out' in terms of expressing myself in the journal or mood monitor... I like that it's online so you can access anytime, as I was having insomnia at the start it was brilliant I had somewhere to go when I felt so alone and scared.

All of our online courses are accessible through the NHS for free, and our clinicians will help you find the course that is most appropriate for your needs.

St Mary's Welcoming Space

There has been a Catholic community in Madeley for c.350 years and St Mary's Church has been a presence on Madeley High Street since 1853, although it is still a work in progress: upon close inspection you will see the building work is unfinished!

Our community has a long tradition of supporting others in the local area – exemplified by our Welcoming Space, held in the Lower Room of our Presbytery every Monday from 10:00am to 13:00pm.

The initiative began in the winter of 2022. Church communities and local charities were invited to access funds intended to enable facilities to open for the benefit of local people; ensuring they had a warm and friendly place to visit when energy costs were rising. Our team of St Vincent de Paul Society volunteers (a Catholic charity supporting communities in England & Wales since 1844) answered the call and launched what became one of 4 warm spaces in the area. It is now recognised as a trusted and valuable local resource, extending the hand of friendship and practical support to every visitor.

Everyone is welcome: we offer a friendly chat alongside hot drinks, soup and snacks. Puzzles and games are available, along with a range of newspapers with tricky crosswords. Such companionship is very important, and we have also developed a range of additional (and strictly confidential) guidance in response to the needs of our visitors.

Advice needed on issues with mobile phones or other IT devices? Need help with a job application? Or perhaps with food bank referrals or welfare support? Struggling to gain access to local council or government services? We can help provide the practical support you need to resolve such issues (or refer you to those who can) alongside providing warm clothes and toiletries.

So please come along for a chat and some friendly cheer. We look forward to seeing you...just follow the signs on the High Street on Monday mornings!

at John Fletcher
School.**

We were so pleased to see so many people at St. Michael's church over the Christmas season. Our attendance was 30% higher than 2024 and of course we were significantly helped by the mild dry weather. We also had our wonderful puppet group taking an active part, which so many people love to see as part of our worshipping life.

We still meet every Sunday at 10.30am and would love to see you at these services. We also have a midweek communion service at 11.00am every Wednesday. We follow this with lunch, and all are welcome. However, we also know that as a church we need to adapt to a quickly changing world.

With this in mind, we are working with John Fletcher School to host a new child friendly act of worship. It is called 'Praise and Play' and is exactly what it says on the tin. It is aimed at preschool children and their parents, grandparents and carers.

Fire Service urges public to 'Stay Current' with electrical fire safety

Local fire services are encouraging residents to take a few simple steps to protect their homes from electrical fires. In 2024, there were over 1,140 accidental electrical fires across England - that's an average of three every single day, many caused by everyday appliances like washing machines and tumble dryers. We want to help you stay safe.

Here's how:

- Check your plugs and sockets. Look out for scorch marks, hot plugs or sockets, flickering lights, or fuses that blow for no clear reason. These could be signs of faulty wiring.
- Register your appliances. It's quick and easy - and it means manufacturers can contact you about safety updates or recalls.
- Be smart with extension leads. Plug large appliances like washing machines and tumble dryers directly into wall sockets. Extension leads can easily become overloaded and increase the risk of fire.
- Don't leave appliances running overnight or while you're out. Turn off washing machines, tumble dryers, and dishwashers before going to bed or leaving the house.
- Make sure you test your smoke alarms regularly
